GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program

Honoring the legacy and character of our nation's 40th President, the GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program rewards college-bound students who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship with financial assistance to pursue higher education.

Each year, the Program selects numerous recipients to receive a \$10,000 scholarship renewable for up to an additional three years – up to \$40,000 total per recipient. Awards are for undergraduate study and may be used for education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, and board. In addition, Scholars are invited to participate in a special awards program and receive ongoing leadership-development support.

Please make sure you've spelled your teacher recommenders' email addresses correctly!

- If you have been accepted to a college, **please bring your letter of acceptance to Student Services** so we can put a copy on file and hang on our college wall.
- If you are applying to a Common App college that is **located in Indiana**, please order your transcript in Parchment to be sent to the Common App. **DO NOT** request your transcript to be sent to the individual Indiana Common App school to which you are applying. As always, if you have questions, please come to Student Services and ask either Mrs. Mumford or Mrs. Roscoe.
- If you are applying directly to a college or through a different portal than Common App, please be sure to fill out and give Mrs. Mumford a green Recommendation sheet and invite her (through her email address) to fill out the school portion of the application.

Sending SAT and/or ACT scores to Colleges

You need to request to have your SAT and ACT scores sent to the colleges you are applying to at least 2 weeks **prior** to the application deadline! To order your SAT scores go to <https://www.collegeboard.org/>. To order your ACT scores go to <http://www.act.org/>.
